Regular vs. Premium Credit Card Rate Chart for Small Business

Currently, understanding which Canadian credit cards can carry premium rates is very challenging for smaller merchants. While both VISA and MasterCard post their interchange rates on their website, information on which cards carry the different rates is difficult to access and understand. Following discussions with CFIB, MasterCard recently posted a list of cards with their associated rate categories on its website. VISA provided CFIB with its rate categories by card and is in the process of posting the information on its site. This chart is designed to allow merchants, employees and customers to understand which cards carry regular or premium rates. While the rate categories should be common to most processors (e.g. Moneris, Global, Chase Paymentech), the merchant fee examples are based on preferred total merchant rates for CFIB members with Chase Paymentech and may differ based on the card processor or specific agreement.

Note: While merchants are allowed to suggest customers use lower cost forms of payment, they are not permitted to surcharge or refuse higher cost cards if they accept that brand.

The Pontiac Chamber of Commerce is looking for a bilingual business oriented individual to implement projects that will create activities and programs to help businesses throughout the Pontiac. Must have strong bilingual communication skills, both written and oral. The contract requires extensive traveling of the Pontiac region and meeting directly with individual businesses.

The activities will involve:

1. Coordination of the mentoring cell in the Pontiac: Training will be provided to enable the candidate knowledge of mentoring, how to coordinate the cell and how to select mentors and mentorees.
2. Organization of networking activities among entrepreneurs: This would involve setting up business breakfasts, networking lunches, after hours business networking activities and organizing fundraising events. The candidate will be required to be the face of the Chamber at events.
3. Organization of a buy local campaign: The candidate will be involved with creating a business coupon campaign and encouraging business to business discounts.

This will be a contract position – 3 days per week, 6 hours per day. Compensation is in the \$18 to \$20K region, depending on qualifications. There is a great potential for additional compensation based on a percentage return basis or additional projects. This is an ideal position for a motivated, business oriented individual.
